In 1920, Victor A. Laciny moved his family to Birmingham, Ala. & listed his occupation as V-Pres-Gen. Manager of South Milk Machinery Co. It is thought he left Laciny Bros. because he was offered a better job and was very independent and didn't like to take orders.

In 1928 he & family are listed as living in Washington, DC.


In 1931 his employer was listed as Southern Dairies where he made copper/German silver vats for ice cream.

In 1934 he is listed in the directory of Birmingham again and started his own company, V A & Co. It didn't last too long as he wasn't a business man.

A 1935 directory shows him back in Washington DC where he did copper work in his basement. He did custom work for Senate Beer & Arrow Beer, as well as Fleischmann Yeast.


